

Understanding ISO 14001:2004

Course Description:

This course is designed to provide participants with a general understanding of the concepts of the ISO 14000 series of standards, specifically ISO 14001:2004 Requirements. Participants will have an opportunity to explore the clauses of ISO 14001:2004 in detail under the guidance of an experienced instructor.

In addition to acquiring knowledge of ISO 14001:2004, students will develop an understanding of the impact of the 'requirements' on the day-to-day operations of most organizations and a basic understanding of the importance of the Environmental Quality Management Principles.

Learning Objectives:

Through a combination of presentation, discussion and practical group exercises, participants will:

- Acquire knowledge of the requirements of the ISO 14001:2004 Standard.
- Develop an understanding of the positive impact an Environmental Management System will have on their organization.
- Recognize the role and importance of Environmental Management in implementing a Quality Management System.
- Develop an understanding of considerations that are required when working within an Environmental Quality Management System.

Who Should Attend:

- Staff and management responsible for working with the ISO 14001:2004 EMS.
- Staff and management who will be expected to have a significant involvement in support of an Environmental Management System.
- Any individual wishing to learn more about ISO 14001:2004 and its place in the management of an organization's environment.

Prerequisite:

None. This is an introductory course intended for staff with little or no knowledge of ISO 14001.
