

Understanding & Implementing ISO 50001:2011

Course Description:

This introductory course will give attendees a broad understanding of the essential components required to implement ISO 50001:2011 - Energy Management Systems (EnMS). This standard provides the framework for organizations to establish, implement and maintain a system to determine their energy costs, uses and wastes and to improve their overall energy performance.

All elements will be covered in detail with practical implementation examples and suggestions for each requirement discussed and illustrated. This workshop is conducted using lectures, hands-on practical exercises and discussions about the various requirements.

Learning Objectives:

Through a combination of presentation, discussion and group exercises, participants will:

- Review the purpose and background of ISO 50001.
- Acquire knowledge of the requirements of the ISO 50001 standard.
- Understand how this standard is implemented in an organization.
- Practice methods for determining energy objectives, targets and legal requirements.
- Appreciate the different factors that should be considered when implementing, or working within, other Quality Management Systems such as ISO 9001 and EMS 14001.

- Functional managers & regulatory personnel.
- Engineers and process owners.
- Employees with involvement in the operation or auditing of the ISO 50001 system to be put in place.
