

Understanding & Implementing OHSAS 18001:2007

Course Description:

This course is designed to provide participants with the knowledge required to implement, monitor, measure and evaluate an OHSAS 18001:2007 Occupational Health & Safety Management System. Participants will have an opportunity to explore the clauses of OHSAS 18001:2007 in detail under the guidance of an experienced instructor, and to practice the skills required to create a OHSAS Manual, as well as identify hazards, assess risks and implement control measures.

Learning Objectives:

Through a combination of presentation, discussion and group exercises, participants will understand:

- The relevant parts of OH&S management system that can enhance business
- The requirements for procedures, work instructions, process improvement plans and other supporting documentation and the applicable document control techniques
- The relationship between OH&S management system and business processes, and the need for an OH&S management system to enhance business.
- How to create a Health & Safety Policy, as well as Health & Safety Objectives.
- How to identify potential hazards in the organization and how to investigate incidents once they have occurred.
- How to assess risks and implement control measures.
- What is required to develop a procedure for response to emergency situations.

Who Should Attend:

- Staff and management responsible for implementing an OHSAS 18001:2007 Occupational Health & Safety Management System.
- Staff and management who will be expected to have a significant involvement in support of an OHSMS.
- Any individual wishing to learn more about OHSAS 18001:2007 and its place in the management of an organization's environment.

Prerequisites:

None. This is an introductory course intended for staff with little or no knowledge of OHSAS 18001:2007.
