

Understanding & Implementing OHSAS 18001:2007 and CSA Z1000-06

Course Description:

This course provides the knowledge, competencies and skills required to implement, monitor, measure and evaluate an Occupational Health & Safety Management System that meets the requirements of the OHSAS 18001:2007 and CSA Z1000-06 standards. Combining hands-on case studies with supporting theory on due-diligence, this course examines the OHSAS 18001:2007 and CSA Z1000-06 requirements from an implementation perspective.

Learning Objectives:

Through presentation, discussion and group exercises, participants will:

- Understand the requirements presented by the OHSAS 18001:2007 and CSA Z1000-06 standards.
- Learn how to develop and updated effective policies for health and safety.
- Know and appreciate the requirements for procedures, work instructions, process improvement plans and other supporting documentation.
- Practice methods for hazard identification and risk assessment.
- Increase their awareness and understanding, as well as their ability to work within an OHSMS that identifies and then eliminates or controls all OHS hazards and risks.

Any employees working to manage, maintain, oversee or improve their company's health and safety program and/or employees responsible for the establishment and implementation of a health and safety program in their organization.
