

## Understanding & Implementing TS 16949:2009

### Course Description:

This introductory course will give attendees a broad understanding of the TS 16949:2009 Quality Management System requirements (as well as its relationship to the ISO 9001:2008 standard) and provide guidance that will help clarify and simplify what is needed to implement a practical, working quality system in a variety of production and service environments.

All elements will be covered in detail with practical implementation examples and suggestions for each requirement discussed and illustrated. This workshop is conducted using lectures, hands-on practical exercises and discussions about the various requirements.

### Learning Objectives:

- Acquire knowledge of the requirements of the TS 16949:2009 standard and its compatibility with other standards.
- Gain an introductory understanding of the Core Tools (FMEA, MSA, SPC, APQP & PPAP).
- Understand how this standard is implemented in an organization.
- Appreciate the different factors that should be considered when implementing, or working within, a TS 16949:2009 Quality Management System.

### Who Should Attend:

- Anyone in the organization responsible for implementing the TS 16949:2009 Quality Management System or anyone who expects to have a significant involvement in support of these activities.
- Employees with involvement in the operation or support of a TS 16949:2009 QMS.
