

Understanding & Implementing CSA Z1000-14

Course Description

This Z1000 “essentials” course has been developed to provide participants with a detailed overview of the requirements of CSA Z1000-14, Canada's National Standard for occupational health and safety management.

The Z1000 standard sets out the framework for an occupational health and safety management system (OHSMS) and follows the Plan-Do-Check-Act model that facilitates integration with the other management systems embraced by progressive organizations (e.g. ISO 14001, ISO 9001, etc.). Developed with the participation of organized labour, management and government representatives, Z1000 is designed to help organizations improve their occupational health & safety performance, with the intent of preventing workplace injuries, illnesses and fatalities.

Who Should Take It

Any employees working to manage, maintain, oversee or improve their company's health and safety program and/or employees responsible for or involved in the decision making for scope of their health and safety program.

Learning Objectives

Through presentation, discussion and group exercises, participants will:

- Gain a thorough understanding of the CSA Z1000-14 standard's essential requirements.
- Develop a good understanding of how effective policies for health and safety are developed and updated.
- Increase their awareness and understanding, as well as their ability to work within an OHSMS that identifies and then eliminates or controls all OHS hazards and risks.
- Understand how this standard works with and relates to other health and safety standards such as OHSAS 18001.
